SHEPHERDS' CORNER

Once again, this week, our hearts go out to the victims of yet another mass shooting - this one at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida. These events have become all too common in recent years and always lead to a discussion of how to make our schools more secure; perhaps by installing fences, metal detectors, surveillance cameras or by enacting tougher gun control. But perhaps a larger security issue is being missed in the national media.

The 10 Commandments used to hang on the walls of our public schools, in our courthouses and other civic institutions. They were widely accepted throughout American society as embodying universal laws that should be universally obeyed. And, among other things, they taught that murder is not only an offense against society – but against God. A generation that believes and accepts these commandments is a security unto itself. We are experiencing the first generation that has grown up without being exposed to them.

Surely there is a connection between what we teach, or fail to teach, our children and what happens in society. The 10 Commandments are the bedrock of western civilization and are needed for a civil and decent society. Others may disagree, but events cannot be ignored. Machine guns have been around for a long time – mass shootings in schools are a recent addition to American history. We may not be in a position to put the 10 Commandments back into our public schools at this time; but we can surely resolve to make certain that we, along with our own children and grandchildren, are grounded in them. Let's do that, while praying for the time to come when our society will, once again, accept, believe and embrace them.
