# SHEPHERDS' CORNER

Proverbs 22:1 affirms that one's reputation is more valuable than one's net worth. After all, if one loses all their money, they can always earn more. However, to be defamed in the eyes of another, to have one's dark secrets exposed by another, to suffer humiliation that results from another's shaming, to lose trust and be considered untrustworthy, well... those things are infinitely more difficult to recover from or restore. Some suggest that a reputation lost can never be reinstated. Perhaps that is why scripture repeated warns of the dangers of gossip.

It has been said that gossip is among the most egregious acts one commits against others. Philosophically similar to murder, gossip harms and possibly kills another's reputation. Makes no difference whether the story is true or not, the damage that results is as malevolently real as blows and bruises of violent hostility. Ask any victim of gossip and they will attest to the enduring pain and suffering that occurs as a result of being the target of aggressions.

Scripture lumps gossip with other iniquities such as jealousy, discord, slander, arrogance, disorderly conduct, selfish ambitions, envy, murder, deceit, malice, and the list goes on and on (Romans 1:29; 2 Cor 12:20). Like feathers in the wind, gossip spreads impunity. Gossip stirs up conflict and separates close friends (Proverbs 16: 28). Its effect is far reaching and uncontrollable. (Proverbs 26:22).

Clearly gossip is something to be avoided. Why is it then that we struggle so to not gossip? How is gossip to be overcome? Luckily scripture provides an answer; Avoid anyone who talks too much (Proverbs 20:19). Avoiding gossip promotes peace (Proverbs 26:20). Promote trust by keeping that which is intended to be secret secret (Proverbs 11:13). It may seem too simple a solution, but to avoid gossip, shouldn't one simply not gossip?

We realize this article may not be the most uplifting, but then neither is anything associated with gossip. Gossip – Just *don't* do it!
