SHEPHERDS' CORNER

The Oak and Squirrel

The end of summer is upon us. Temperatures are steadily in decline, leaves have begun changing colors, acorns have started to fall from an Oak tree, and the sun setting a little sooner each day are but a few of the tell-tale signs of the annual seasonal progression. Hard at work are the animals whose destiny is to live out the chill of winter. With a confident assurance of winter's approach, wildlife can be seen hard at work storing up their winter supply of food. From the comfort of our living room, a pair of squirrels my family has named Larry and Pickles, can be observed all throughout the day tirelessly foraging local tree nuts such as walnuts and acorns. Busy, busy, busy are Larry and Pickles. All day long they gather and gather. Hurriedly finding and burying each nut in his/her secret locations. One new nut, one new hole, carefully covered and camouflaged to prevent others from disturbing their buried treasure. When the cold of winter finally arrives, though he/she may search and search, Larry and Pickles will not consume all that they have foraged. Invariably and Inevitably, due to the imperfect memory of squirrels, a grove of new Oaks will one day appear as a slow and steady march across empty pastures - made possible by the symbiotic relationship of God's creation. Squirrels use the Oak as a food source, a place of safety when avoiding predators, and so on. The Oak relies on the squirrels (and other similar creatures) to spread its seed. If the oak's seeds were not scattered, new starts would quickly wither in the shade of mature trees. In a very real sense, Squirrels and Oaks are dependent on the other. Many other examples of similar coexistent relationships can be observed throughout nature, for after all, that is God's design; many parts working together for the ultimate benefit of the whole.

The same is true of our spiritual side. God's design is that people work together, each contributing a tiny bit in relation to their own unique gifts/talents. (1 Corinthians 12).

Some things to consider: What's your gift? In what ways are you like a "spiritual squirrel"? How are you similar to a "spiritual Oak"? And are you using your gifts as an encouragement to others?
